The Waikato A & P Association wish to thank all Sponsors and ask Exhibitors wherever possible to support their Sponsors and thank them for their sponsorship.

INFORMATION & RULES

The general rules and regulations for the governance and conduct of the Waikato A&P Show shall be the same as the rules and regulations revised in 1992 and circulated to all A&P Associations. It shall be deemed acceptable as if they had been reprinted in full in this schedule. To show your animal YOU MUST be a member of a club affiliated to the RAS. A copy of these rules is available for perusal at the Secretary's office.

DAIRY GOAT RULES

1. Does in milk must not be milked out before they are judged, except for the second half of best udder class.
2. The practice of gluing of teats, in any form, or any foreign substances in the udder is considered an act of malpractice and will result in disqualification.
3. Does will not be penalised if it is necessary to ease their udders before judging, owing to their udders being overstocked.
4. Does may not be stripped out in the ring.
5. The standard RAS bylaws for the exhibition of dairy goats shall apply.
6. Judges shall not judge any animals owned by them or their immediate family including defacto relationships. This excludes leased animals.
7. Reserve Championship. The second prize winner in the class from which the Champion was selected, is to parade with the other prize winners for Reserve Champion.
8. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.
9. PROTEST: Any protest must be made in writing, signed by the person making the complaint and delivered to the Secretary accompanied by \$200 cash which will be refunded should the protest be upheld.

ENTRY FEES:

\$6 per class, per animal, unless otherwise stated (Incl GST).

Please ensure you add up all your fees correctly and send the correct payment with your entry form to the Secretary. Goat Section (details above). Include payment or direct credit to BNZ 02 0316 0400 334 00 (see entry form).

ENTRIES CLOSE: Monday, 24th September 2018.

Late entries will be accepted with a 50% penalty up till Friday 28 September 2018.

CONFIRMATION OF ENTRIES:

Confirmation of entries will be sent to each exhibitor once the entry has been received by the Secretary. If you have not received your confirmation within 10 working days after posting it please call the office immediately.

CATALOGUES:

\$4.00. These are COMPULSORY so please ensure you add the fee with your entries. Catalogues can be picked up from your Head Steward on the day of showing.

GROUND FEES:

Ground Fees of \$5.00 per goat, any age, but capped at \$15, must be paid with entries.

TICKETS:

These will be posted with your exhibitor's letter.

PUBLICATION OF EXHIBITOR'S NAME:

Entry in the Show entitles the Association to publish Exhibitors names / photos in result reports and distribute with Exhibitor lists.

PRIZE MONEY:

1st \$8, 2nd \$6, 3rd \$4, unless stated otherwise.

Will be paid by direct banking only, within one month of show ending.

Notifications must be made no later than the 11/12/18 Notification after this date will not be considered.

If promised sponsorship is not forthcoming the Association cannot be held liable. All entry fees and prize money are GST inclusive.

ANY EXHIBITOR WHO FAILS TO COMPLY WITH THE RULES, MAY FORFEIT THEIR PRIZEMONEY.

PROTEST:

Any protest must be made within 1 hour of the completion of the class in writing, signed by the person making the complaint and delivered to the Secretary accompanied by \$200 cash (CHEQUES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED) which will be refunded should the protest be upheld.

YELLOW CARD:

The following text will appear on every affiliated A&P Show/Event Schedule.

This Show supports the RAS 'Yellow Card' system. A Yellow Card will be issued, in cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behaviour as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulations/Bylaws including the Equestrian Rulebook, the RAS affiliated Show/Event/registered Measuring Stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the Person Responsible a Yellow Warning Card (either immediately or within 10 days of the

show) which suspends any penalty until possible new offences. Full wording of the 'Yellow Card' system is available to view on the RAS website – www.ras.org.nz.

FORBIDDEN SUBSTANCES:

The Rules of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand in regard to Forbidden Substances apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show/Event and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible's risk.

Forbidden Substance - Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, muscoskeletal or urogenital systems.

ARREARS:

No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other show/event charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated show/event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.

SUMMARY OF RAS RESOLUTION PROCESS:

The full process can be found on the RAS website www.ras.org.nz. The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases it should be dealt with directly by the show. If the matter is in regards to an RAS official, the show may request the assistance of RAS Head Office as to how to deal with this in an appropriate manner.

LEGAL LIABILITY/SUPERVISION & CONTROL OF ANIMALS:

The Association's policy does not cover Competitors or Exhibitors. Each exhibitor must supervise and control their animals at all times and shall be liable for any hazard created or accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the Showgrounds. Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate Animal Legislation and the Health and Safety in Employment Act 2016. No person is permitted in any judging ring without express permission from the Head Steward of that ring. Only persons directly responsible for an Exhibit are permitted in the marshalling area.

TEST AND TAG:

Due to 2016 H&S Regulations and because Claudelands Events Centre is a business property, all electrical leads and electrical appliances brought on to the property must have a current Test N Tag Electrical Certificate. Any lead or appliance not compliant will need to be tested and certified on site at the owner's cost.

PLEASE NOTE: All Anglo-Nubians entered in this section are to be registered with the Anglo-Nubian Breed Society of New Zealand (Inc) unless otherwise stated. Classes to be run under Anglo-Nubian Breed Society of New Zealand (Inc), Waikato A & P Association & RAS rules and regulations. To show your animal YOU MUST be a member of a club affiliated to the RAS.

All Anglo-Nubians in this section must be registered with the ANBSNZ.

No Recorded Grade or Crossbred (first cross) goats may be exhibited.

Any Recorded (Appendix a,b,c,d or Crossbred z,y,a) goats must be of a good Anglo-Nubian type.
