## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

No pre-registration is required. Contestants and Animals just need to show up on the day, go to their correct ring as notified in this schedule or displayed on the notice board on site.

The pupils must wear an ID CARD which should have the following details shows. The Child name, School and Animals Name on one side. The reverse side will have the ring number leaving room for the Child's entry number as allocated by the Ring Steward at the time of the first event.

You school or group may supply you with these ID Cards or you may need to create your own using a 128cm x 7sm card and a pin. These are not supplied by the Show Group.

An exhibiting child must be of a Primary or Intermediate school age only. *Secondary school children are not eligible.*

All participants have a Due Care responsibility and must be able to manage and control their animal or may be asked to leave the area.

**A child may exhibit one animal only in the Boys and Girls section of the Waikato A&P Show.**

## JUDGING

Judging commences at 10am in all sections. Entries will be accepted up until 10.30am

## LUNCH

Judging will not stop for lunch. However, hot and cold food/drink will be available on site at all times.

## LAMB SAVING DATES

Early Lambs	01 July to 19 August
Late Lambs	20 August to 20 September

**NOTE:** Some saving dates are flexible; 01 July and 20 September are not.

## PUPIL AGE DIVISIONS IN LAMB CLASSES AND RINGS

Sub Junior	5 to 6 years	Rings 7 and 8
Junior	7 to 8 years	Rings 5 and 6
Intermediate	9 to 10 years	Rings 3 and 4
Senior	11 and over	Rings 1 and 2

*Age as on the day of the competition 26 October 2018*

Numbers in the Early and Late Rearing classes may be adjusted on the day according to the numbers of entries in each ring, e.g. floating date.

1. Lambs may be covered and brushed BUT NOT WASHED, wire brushes should not be used.
2. Note: No feeding of lambs is permissible until after completion of the judging of Most Obvious Pet and Leading
3. Ram lambs and long tailed lambs are eligible for competition.

## THE COMPETITION

This will comprise Most Obvious Pet, Leading, Rearing Early and Rearing Late in that order.

Rearing classes are judged on condition, care, cleanliness and child knowledge.

*Six ribbons will be awarded in each class.*

*Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons will be awarded for Most Obvious Pet, Leading, Rearing Early and Rearing Late.*

*The champion of Most Obvious Pet and the champion of Leading lambs will re-run both events, and the lamb that scores highest overall both events will be rewarded the Athol McLachlan Trophy.*

## EXPLANATION

The first placed lamb in each class will parade in the Championship Ring from which the Champion Lamb will be selected. The lamb placed second to the Champion in the respective class will then be brought in and judged against the remaining first placed lambs for reserve champion.

## TEAM OF THREE CLASS

This class comprises Teams of Three Lambs and is judged on uniformity and leading.

There is no limit to the number of teams representing a school.

*Three ribbons will be awarded to the first, second, third, fourth, fifth, and sixth placed teams.*

## PUPIL AGE DIVISIONS IN KID GOAT CLASSES

Sub Junior	5 and 6 years	Ring 1
Junior	7 and 8 years	Ring 2
Intermediate	9 and 10 years	Ring 3
Senior	11 and over	Ring 4

*Age as on the day of competition 26<sup>th</sup> October 2018*

Numbers in the Early and Late Rearing classes may be adjusted on the day according to the numbers of entries in each ring, e.g. floating date.

1. Any breed of kid goat is acceptable.
2. Buck goats are eligible for competition.



## COMPETITION

This will comprise Most Obvious Pet, Leading, Rearing Early and Rearing Late.

Rearing classes are judged on condition, care, cleanliness and child knowledge.

*Buck goats are eligible for competition.*

Four ribbons will be awarded for each class.

Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons will be awarded for Most Obvious Pet, Leading, Rearing Early and Rearing Late.

## EXPLANATION

The first placed kid goat in each class will parade in the Championship Ring from which the Champion Kid Goat will be selected. The kid goat placed second to the Champion in its respective class will then be brought in and judged against the remaining first placed kid goats for reserve champion.

## TEAM OF THREE CLASS

This class comprises Teams of Three Kid Goats and is judged on uniformity and leading. There is no limit to the number of teams representing a school.

*Three ribbons will be awarded to the first, second, third, fourth, fifth, and sixth placed teams.*
